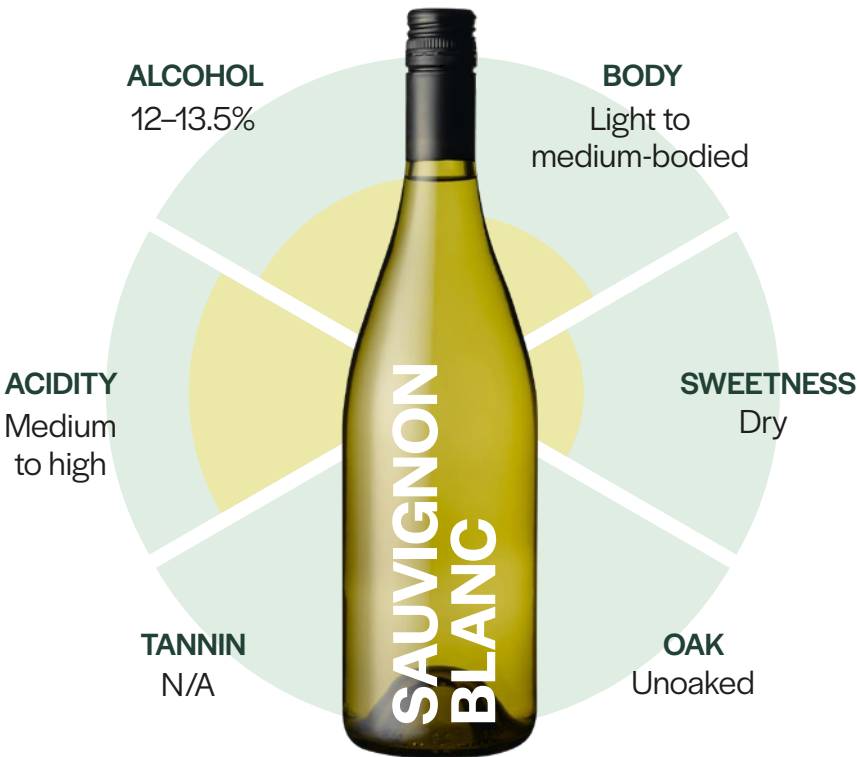


SAUVIGNON BLANC

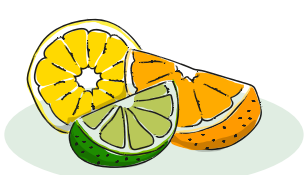

WINEMAKING TECHNIQUES

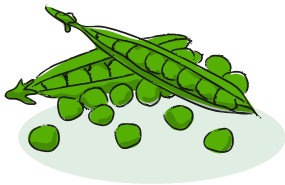

Today there is also a growing number of experimental producers creating interesting, complex, textural wines through techniques such as wild fermentation, skin contact and fermentation in oak and clay amphora.

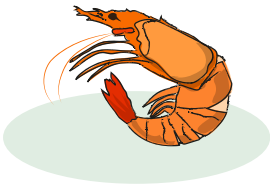

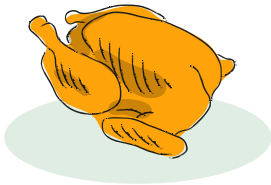
