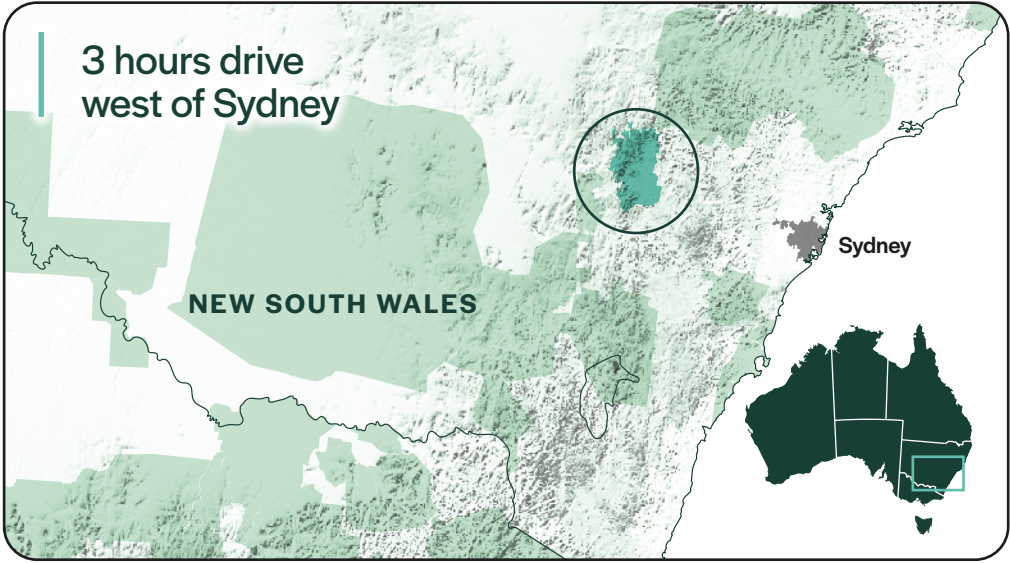


ORANGE

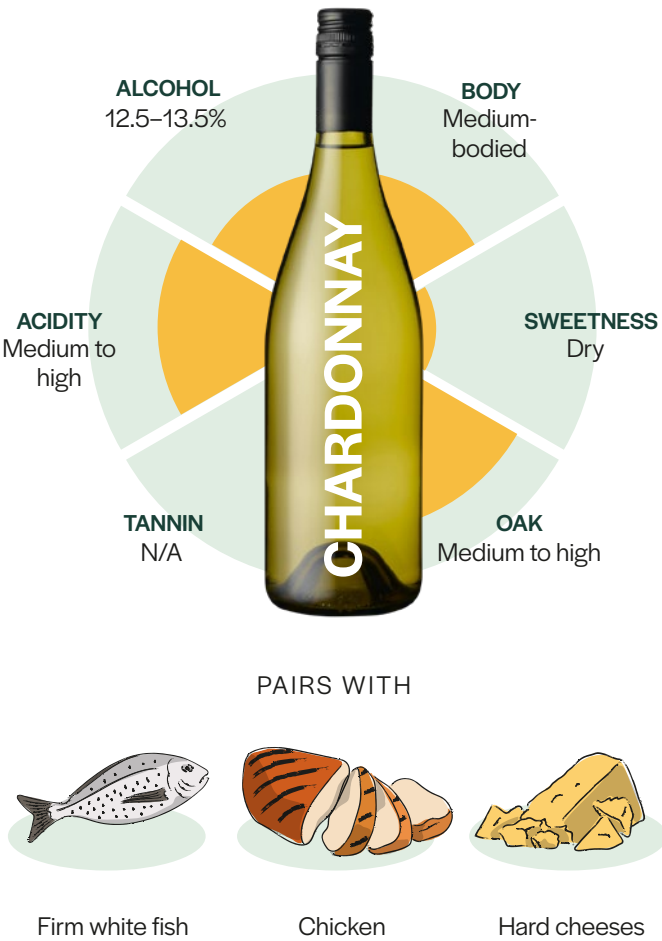
Orange is Australia’s highest altitude wine region, known for its exemplary cool-climate wines. Wines generally embody the signature cool-climate style, ranging from light to medium in body, with pronounced fruit flavours and a high level of natural acidity.



NOTEWORTHY VARIETIES

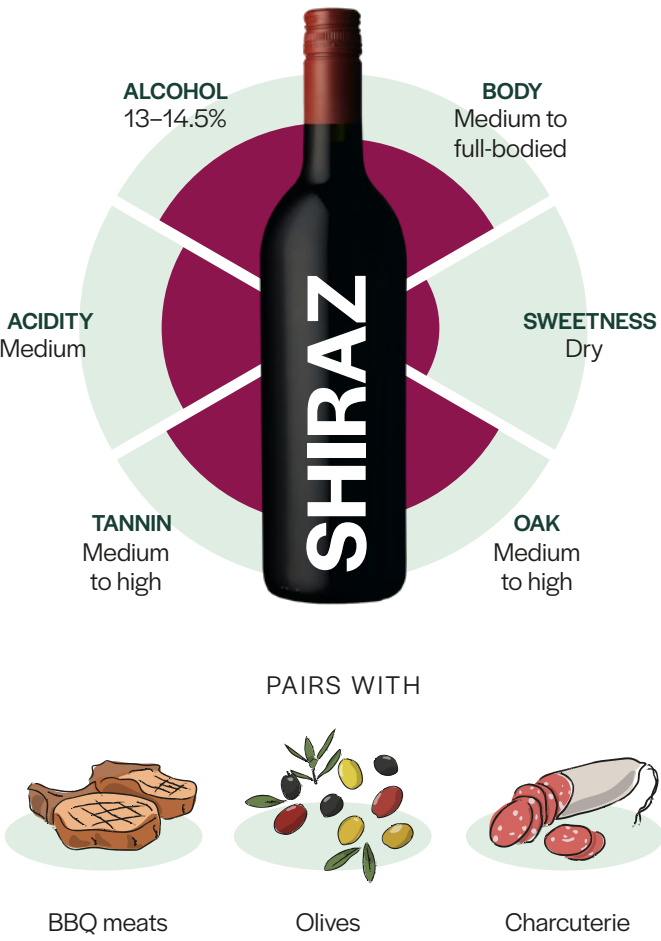
Chardonnay

Wines range from crisp and elegant through to robust and full-flavoured.



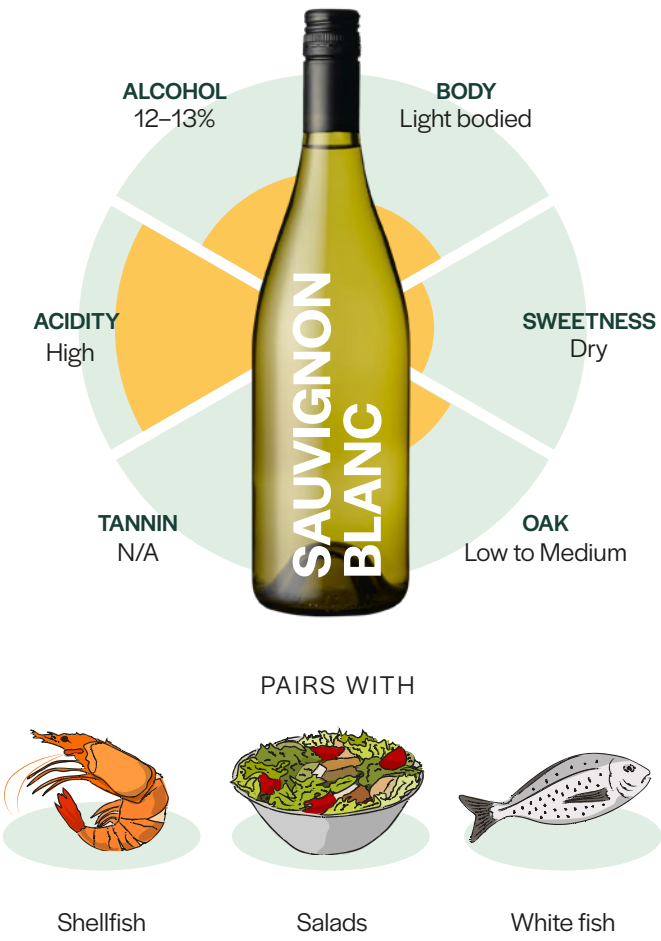
Shiraz

Cool-climate styles, typically medium bodied and elegant.



Sauvignon Blanc

Well suited to the cool climate, producing wines with pronounced trademark tropical fruit characters.



ALL ABOUT ALTITUDE

Orange is Australia’s highest wine region, with vineyards stretching from 600m to more than 1,000m above sea level. It also happens to be the only one in the country that’s defined by elevation – the requirement being that vineyards must sit at 600m or higher to be classed as part of the Orange GI. The 500m rise across the GI allows for a wide spectrum of red and white varieties to be grown.
